Moi-même	<p>Introduce myself with a rigorous level of detail:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Who I am: age, dob, nationality, where I live</li> <li>- Physical and personality description</li> <li>- Hobbies/leisure</li> <li>- What my routine looks like</li> </ul> <p>Use of idiomatic French at Senior Level</p> <p>Possible written/reading/listening topics: Understand others giving details about themselves, talking about myself and my preferences.</p> <p><b>Be able to write an informal letter to a friend describing your routines / school</b></p>	
En famille	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Family members (beyond my household)</li> <li>- Describe members of my family (personality/physique/profession/how our relationship is)</li> <li>- Talk about my house and its features</li> <li>- Household chores and how these are split at home</li> </ul> <p>Possible written/reading/listening topics: co-leaving, new family models, our relationship with siblings, housing crisis.</p> <p><b>Be able to write an informal letter describing your family members in detail as well as household chores and where do you live</b></p>	
Mon quartier	<p>Describing where I live:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Location</li> <li>- Amenities and buildings</li> <li>- Social issues</li> <li>- City and countryside</li> <li>- What is in offer for young people</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Tourism and local attractions</li> <li>- What I enjoy the most about my neighbourhood</li> </ul> <p>Possible written/reading/listening topics: advantages and inconveniences of living in the city vs countryside, neighbourhood issues and social problems.</p> <p><b>Be able to write an informal letter describing your area in detail</b></p>	
<b>Reading section</b>	Higher Level journalistic text – 30 min	
<b>Written section</b>	Informal letter – 25 min	
<b>Grammar</b>	<p>Imperative to revise Grammar section in OneNote and its subsections and grammar categories (pronouns, adjectives, verbs, articles, nouns, adverbs)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Présent simple: verbes réguliers et irréguliers – les verbes pronominaux.</li> <li>- Passé récent, passé composé</li> <li>- Futur simple, future proche</li> <li>- La négation</li> <li>- Les pronoms -en- et -y-</li> <li>- L'accord avec avoir</li> <li>- Être en train de...</li> </ul>	
<b>Important notes</b>	<p>Spelling demons: identify those words that you normally misspell (subsection in OneNote and/or in your carnet).</p> <p>Idiomatic French: revise key expressions/idioms that can elevate your written compositions per topic – you will find these in OneNote, under each subsection – petit quiz too!</p> <p>French connectors: essential for your written tasks to link ideas and paragraphs.</p> <p>Revise the structure and formalisms of the informal letter</p> <p>Reading section:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- revise the type of questions you have encountered in reading assignments - 6Ws.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Isolate each of the text sections to better identify answers.</li><li>- The title and the last question (development in English) will give you cues about the text content.</li></ul>	
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
