

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




Penpals - 1st Year students



Classes




- The first class of the day is tutor time which starts at 8.30 and is 15 minutes long. Each actual class is one hour long. You will have two classes after tutor (period 1 and 2) and then break time.
- After break, you will have another two classes (period 3 and 4) and then lunch. After lunch you will either have 1 or 2 classes (period 5 and 6) depending if it is a short or long day. Mondays and Wednesdays, school ends at 3.30. The rest of the days, it finishes at 2.30.

Lunch and break time






Break time is after the 2nd period and lasts 15 minutes. You can sit in the canteen, go outside, or go to the bathroom during this time.




Lunch time is after the 4th period and lasts 30 minutes. At the end of lunch, you can go to your lockers for the last 5 minutes.

- Write your passcode in your journal so if you forget it is always there.






In class

- When waiting for the teacher outside the class stand In tight to the wall so you're not blocking up the corridor.











Digital Skills

Incidental Inspection 2019

Highly effective across all areas with no recommendations. The quality of learning and teaching was excellent.

Subject Inspection in Science October 2019

PLANNING FOR

EFFECTIVE HOMEWORK

WHAT OUTCOMES ARE EXPECTED?

Homework should be assigned with a clear purpose as to the learning outcomes expected. Give success criteria and rubrics - What knowledge and

skills do you want students to exhibit in their work? What does an excellent answer look like?

Written Instructions

VIA THE JOURNAL OR ONENOTE

There should be no confusion about what students are being asked to do or how to do it. Give written instructions which students can access from home, via the journal or Teams/OneNote.



Linked to classwork

NOT USED TO TEACH NEW MATERIAL

Homework should be explicitly related to classwork and not used to teach new material.

Students should understand the concepts and possess the skills needed to complete any homework assignment.



HOMEWORK MUST BE DOABLE

Students should be able to complete the homework on their own with relative ease. Differentiate for varying ability levels - scaffolding, variety choice in modes of presentation



Feedback

FORMATIVE FEEDBACK ESSENTIAL

Reinforce what has been done well and re-teach concepts & skills that homework has demonstrated students have not
